They can assist with complex cases of domestic violence, sexual assault, child abuse, elder abuse, and stalking. Immediate access to on-site partners with the Witness/Victim Service Center, Domestic Violence & Child Advocacy Center, Cleveland Rape Crisis Center, FrontLine Services, City of Cleveland Prosecutor, Cleveland Police, and the Division of Children & Family Services.</p> <p>-Amy McNally (216) 443-6566 is the advocate in the felony arraignment room. She has access to prosecutor files to request higher bonds as well as GPS monitoring. The GPS is then tracked by the sheriff's office.</p> <p>-Jaida Patterson (216) 698-6499 can assist clients with the Safe at Home program. The Safe at Home program is the address confidentiality program run through the State that can convert an address to a PO Box.</p> <p>-Holly Mack (216) 348-4097-DCFS Child Advocate Cuyahoga County Jail</p> <p>Civil Protection Orders- Can be for 5 years and can be filed and completed within 1 day at the Family Justice Center.</p> <p>Criminal Protection Orders- Must be filed at the prosecutor's office and are only valid up until the time the perpetrator is sentenced in court and then is no longer valid.</p> <p>-Victims must have time to complete the filing for a protection order as it typically will take up to a day to complete. Victim will need to bring their photo id, perpetrator date of birth and address for the filing.</p> <p>Victims can file for civil protection orders prior to the batterer's release from jail.</p> <p>No appointment is needed. Please visit between 8:30-4:30, Monday through Friday.</p>

In-home counseling for children up to age 12 is available in most cases. Counseling for youth 12-18 is available in office-based locations.</p> <p>Victim Assistance-specialists support children and families through the criminal justice process, as well as medical exams.</p> <p>Caregiver Support Counseling-counseling for any caregiver of a child exposed to rape, sexual abuse or sex trafficking.</p> <p>Through Project STAR (Sex Trafficking Advocacy & Recovery), Cleveland Rape Crisis Center provides expert, trauma-informed crisis intervention, advocacy and counseling to survivors of sex trafficking in our community.</p>

An advocate will also help victims apply for victim compensation and will, if needed, arrange for victims to receive more specialized assistance, such as substance abuse treatment, sexual assault or domestic violence services, legal advocacy, or other community supports. The Trauma Recovery Center at May Dugan Center was established to support you after a traumatic event resulting from a criminal act against your person. We provide 16 weeks of crisis stabilization services. Services are free to victims and their families through the Victims of Crime Act and the State of Ohio Attorney General's Office. All aspects of the services are voluntary and without obligation. Participants of any groups are encouraged to bring their children, grades K – 7, to a concurrent art activity group facilitated by registered Art Therapists. Case Management and Safety Planning JFSA helps clients navigate the maze of social service, legal, medical, and vocational systems that individuals must work to achieve self-sufficiency. This includes: Safety assessments Planning Assistance in obtaining and coordinating referral services Accompanying clients on appointments Trauma Specific Therapy (including EMDR) Justice System Advocacy and Legal Resources For many victims of abuse, working through the court system is a necessary step. JFSA helps clients understand their legal options, current laws and court processes, and can accompany them as they navigate the justice system. Special Populations Some segments of the community face additional barriers to overcoming abuse. JFSA also provides culturally specific services for the Jewish community, immigrants, the elderly, people with serious mental illness and disabilities, and LGBTQ community.
